


## Midwest Baking with Shauna Sever



## 3D Print at the library!

Turn your ideas into reality using the library's new 3D Printing service. Create tools, toys, prototypes, replacement parts, scale models, figurines, jewelry, and more! Design an object yourself using a 3D modeling tool such as TinkerCAD, or find a ready-made file at Thingiverse.com. Submit your project to be 3D printed via the library's website. Objects cost \$0.10 per gram and are printed using PLA filament in 9 available colors.

**How does 3D printing work?** 3D printers build physical objects from digital models by laying down successive levels of material. PLA filament is heated in the printer's nozzle, which is then extruded into the shape of the design, cools down, and hardens to become the final object.
