

Introducing Our Outdoor Pickup Lockers

We are excited to announce that you can now use our outdoor lockers to pick up your holds any time of day, at your convenience! The lockers are located on the north side of the building and are accessible 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

- To use the lockers, select "Wilmette Public Library- 24/7 Pickup Lockers" when you request items in the library catalog. You can also call the library, and we can transfer your holds to the lockers.
- When your hold is ready, you will receive a notice that you can pick it up at the lockers. Follow the directions on the screen to retrieve your items. You will need your library card. Items will be checked out to you automatically; you do not need to take any further action. Retrieve your items, close the locker, and you're done!

The lockers have replaced our Parking Lot Pickup service. Over the past 2.5 years, we had more than 15,000 Parking Lot Pickup appointments! We look forward to continuing to meet your quick pickup needs with the 24/7 lockers.
