A Look Back at 2024

This winter, we'll be sharing our 2024 Annual Report with the Wilmette community. This report will be a reflection of our year in numbers, including our circulation, programming, attendance, finances, and more. We take this opportunity each year to take stock of our impact on the Wilmette community and plan for the future.

A snapshot of our year in numbers:

- Circulation increased 4% since 2023, with 898,667 total items circulated from our collections.
- We have seen particular growth in our use of digital resources, with a 33% increase in use of electronic content.
- There are 16,200 active Wilmette library cards held by Wilmette and Kenilworth residents.
- Library visits increased 12% in 2024, with 242,730 patron visits.
- The library offered 1,112 programs for children, teens, and adults, an 8% increase from 2023, with 32,979 attendees, 24% more than in 2023.


